A significant event that is worthy of special note is the fact that the EC had the opportunity to engage with the Mineral Rights Board (MRB). This initiative sets the pace for honest conversations that will demystify the licensing process and facilitate KCM to render seamless service to members.

I would like to personally thank all stakeholders for making the Jukwaa la Wachimba Madini an event like no other that climaxed at the stakeholder engagement dinner. The dinner was graced by Mr. Louis Hirst, the Second Secretary, the Australian High Commission, and Mr. Elijah Mwangi, Principal Secretary of the State Department for Mining who gave a key presentation on how to get the industry back on its feet.

I register my deepest gratitude to our esteemed members and all partners for making it possible for the EC to reinvigorate KCM in the first quarter of 2023.
